The Broten Young Scholars Program

The Young Scholars Recognition Award program was established by the Western College Physical Education Society in 1987 to encourage the involvement of younger college and university physical educators in WCPES. In 2004, the Western College Physical Education Society changed its name to the Western Society for Kinesiology and Wellness. A call for papers is made annually by WSKW. Submitted papers are reviewed and award winners are selected. Time is allotted during the annual WSKW conference for young scholars to present their papers.

Interested in Submitting a Paper?

- Candidates for the Young Scholars Award must be full time faculty members currently employed in a related field of kinesiology or health at the college or university level.
- Evaluation of Young Scholars papers, conducted by a committee of professionals in the field, is based on their scholarly content, their organization, and their pertinence to the profession.
- Topics may be chosen from any "issue" facing the field of kinesiology and health. Research reports, position papers, philosophical statements, or summary of the present state of any issue may serve as the basis for the scholarly papers.
